Monthly Meeting - 26th April

After the announcements—Malvern trip, exhibition review etc. we were given a demonstration on the various creative ways in which folds and pin tucks could be incorporated with quilts.

Gail, Geraldine and Rita had set up their sewing machines at the front of the hall. Geraldine talked about the basic methods of creating accurate lines of stitching, both traditional and with the aid of special machine feet and in particular the use of a twin needle. We were told about a foot with a special groove to keep the lines straight and also a foot with a groove in which a gimp thread could be laid which resulted in a more pronounced line.



Gail showed us creative ways of using variegated threads, different fabrics, free motion stitching, criss-crossing lines etc. She also had samples of quilting with twin needles.



There was then an opportunity to use the machines on squares of Egyptian cotton which had been sourced from Empress Mills.

A challenge was issued at the end for members to take a square of cotton and experiment at home. The resulting work will then be brought to the next meeting and combined into a sampler quilt.

Twin needles were available to buy for those who did not have one.
