We will then draw up a shortlist and get members to vote for their favourite.

This will probably be started at an SOS day sometime in the future—the show is not until 2020 so there is no great hurry at present!

Please bear in mind that we could do with a new storage space for our quilt stands at some point so let us know if you hear of anywhere.

AGM

Apologies were received from 14 members but there were enough present for the meeting to take place.

Chairpersons Report— Sandra began by saying that she had enjoyed her first year as chairperson and went on to thank the committee members who had provided support throughout.

The minutes of the last AGM, which had been emailed beforehand, were agreed and seconded and there were no matters arising.

Praise went to all members for helping to put on a successful exhibition at Easter. The next one will be in 2020 and will celebrate 20 years of MSQ.

The bi-annual Club Day with talks on Russian Textiles by Pamela Smith and Collecting Quilts by Margaret Johnson, had been well attended and made a small profit.

Special thanks went to Gail, Geraldine and Rita for their continued hard work in putting together inspiring samples, demonstrations and practical activities.

Members have continued to support the supply of premmie quilts for Basingstoke hospital which have been collected and delivered by Julia.

Cheryl has regularly updated the web page for us.

Joanne and Sandra have kept up with finding interesting raffle prizes for us each month.

Treasurers Report—Sue has kept an accurate account of income and expenditure over the year and the group still has a healthy balance (the report will be emailed separately). The accounts have been audited by Barbara as correct.

Membership has remained between 42 and 46.

There has been a slight increase in the hourly rental fee paid at Greenham.

Therefore, the annual sub will stay the same at £20pa and the cost at each meeting will remain at £3.

The profits from the raffle quilt at the exhibition allowed us to send a donation to a local charity for blind and partially sighted people—The Living Paintings Trust.

Activities Report— Gail reminded us of all the different things which had been organised during the year—we managed to go on trips to the West of England Quilt Show twice as the date was changed from November to September!

The committee also organised the outing to the Malvern Quilt Show in the Spring.

During the SOS days we have been shown how to make the most of our machines; a free motion workshop to make a street scene with Anne Hellyer; a Somerset folded patchwork workshop led by member Sue Cuff and also the establishment of annual PAT testing for all of our electrical equipment.

Gail, Geraldine and Rita have also put in a lot of hard work creating samples of inspirational ways in which we could use basic techniques within our quilted creations.

I am very pleased to report that they are willing to carry on organising our activities for another year.

Election of Officers—the official business of re-electing the members of the committee was conducted with all members willing to stand again.

Weaving with Ribbons

This demonstration gave us some brilliant ideas for using ribbons within our quilting and creative work. It could be done with a variety of ribbons, braids, threads, torn strips of fabric etc.

It was suggested that a frame made of foamboard made an ideal base to make the woven piece on as pins could be used to hold the ribbon in place and the weave could be viewed from both sides to see which was preferred. However, any solid soft base such as a small ironing board could be used and the ribbons could also be held in place with tape..



It was advised that the piece be started in the middle as this would become the focal point.



Once the design was complete it could be held with an iron-on bonding or double sided bonding to fix it to a backing fabric.

Ideas

Negative spaces could be left between the ribbons..



The ribbons could be inserted into a block....



The ribbons could be plaited before use....



The ribbons could create a basket weave....



Ribbons or, as here, strips of fabric, could be used for reverse applique in a block to make up in to a cushion or quilt.

Show and Tell
