Having practiced on the premmie quilts Cheryl had used her Sweet Sixteen machine for a quilt. She was proud of the fact that she had not done any 'stitch in the ditch' this time but a bespoke design.



Sandra K from Lorne Hill Quilters brought two examples of medallion quilts which had been made at their workshop in East Garston under the guidance of the tutor Lynne Johnson. This is a popular and ongoing workshop if you would like to make your own.



Bag Demonstration

Geraldine and Gail had organised two different bags which could be made at the SOS this Saturday.



The first is a soft slouch shoulder bag which requires 1 metre of each fabric and can have a zip and pocket inserted if desired.



The second is a more firm bag with handles. The whole body has iron on stiffener and it is fastened with a loop and toggle.

A display had been set out at the back of the room of all the bags which have been used during the series of demonstrations. Also various books and magazines with ideas for more bags. Although these have now been returned to the Club library they are still available—please ask me.

Our thanks go to our activities team for all of the hard work they have put in to the preparation of these demonstrations.

Quilt Stands

YOUR HELP NEEDED

We urgently need somewhere to store the Club's quilt stands. Currently they ae in a members mum's garage but this was a temporary measure and we really do need to find somewhere permanent.

They require the space of about half a garage or a small/medium shed.

Do you or someone you know have a garage we could use or maybe part of a barn. It would need to be water tight as the stands are wooden and need to be kept dry.

Failing that, have you or anyone you know got a space with a hardstanding in a garden or rural setting where we could erect a metal shed.

The stands are generally only accessed every three years when we have an exhibition so they would cause little disruption.

This is getting urgent now, we have been asking for a couple of years. If nowhere is found we may have to sell the stands and hire some from another group when needed.

There would be costs involved with all options but unless someone comes up with another practical solution we will need to use Club funds.
