Also we all need to press on to complete things which we would like to display in our exhibition in October. This will be held at **Newbury College** on **October 29th and 30th** in the central area which is known as The Street. All members are invited to show work of whatever size and the exhibition subcommittee will let you know all the details asap.

There will be raffle tickets to sell to family and friends with the proceeds going to Time to Talk which is a local charity supporting the mental health of young people.

January Meeting

At long last we were able to have a proper meeting—well almost. The chairs were still set out in a circle but so many members turned up that we had to keep making it bigger and bigger. In the end there were 28 members and 3 visitors, 2 of whom joined up. Also most people kept their masks on....

Unfortunately Geraldine was unable to come so Gail stood in at the last minute and ran the meeting. She welcomed everybody then ran through the programme for the year.

Sew on Saturday workshops

Unfortunately we are unable to use St George's hall this year even though the days had been booked well in advance, as they have decided to only have regular bookings. This means that the SOS days will be in St Francis parish hall and because it is so much smaller only 12 people will be able to attend. Members were able to sign up at the meeting but there are spaces left on both April workshops so get in touch if you would like to put your name on the list.

There are two Sew on Saturday workshops organised, costing £25.

On 2nd April Marianne will lead one on art quilts for which you would need to decide upon a theme. You will then make lots of 4.5" squares using different fabrics and decorative techniques. She has asked that those attending start collecting fabrics, threads, beads and inspirational photographs. Her example shows an Indian Spice theme ...



And Sonia's has a water theme.



The following SOS day is on April 30th with Anne Hellyer, a visiting tutor who will show how to make her 3D free motion stitched houses which can be lit with LED lights. This one was recently completed by Rita from an earlier workshop and it has been so admired that several people had asked for the lesson to be repeated.



Somebody asked about having our machines PAT tested before bringing them to a workshop. Pauline will check on the regulations for the hall but she did not think it would be a problem.

The SOS day in July has yet to be finalised and the one in September is so close to the exhibition that it is being reserved for preparations and for finishing work to be exhibited.

Monthly meetings

February

There will be a discussion about various helpful gadgets and pieces of equipment which members have come across. Also things which were not as helpful as they at first appeared!!

Please bring any sewing and items for Show and Tell as normal along with any gadgets you would like to show.

March

Sue has been working very hard to prepare some samples of the type of work she will be teaching us over the next few months.

Hand stitching will deal with traditional quilting designs. She asks that we prepare a quilt sandwich to bring with us and then we can mark it out and begin stitching during the meeting. One possibility is that you could prepare a piece to make a premmie quilt (16" x 20" finished size) or one to make into a cushion cover.



April

Sue will show us ideas for decorative hand stitching which could be used to embellish quilts and wall hangings. She brought an example of a covered book which uses various stitches and threads to enhance crazy patchwork.




There will also be a **Bring and Buy** sale for which you can price your fabrics, books, magazines etc. and bring a named pot to collect your money in.

May

Sue will be showing us how to create bargello patterns. For this you would need to collect 5 fabrics of which one is an accent colour. The fabrics need to have small patterns as large ones would be lost in the cutting of strips.

More details and any requirements will be sent out before each meeting.



Show and Tell

Sue brought along the completed BOM which many members started during Lockdown. In fact she has titled it Stars in Lockdown.



It was begun as a learning project and some members commented on their difficulties and achievements.

Several people had made practice blocks first and then decided upon colours to make a complete quilt, learning about combining colours whilst doing so. Using a rotary cutter and judging quarter inch seams were common problems as was meshing the seams on the back of the quilt. All agreed it had been a very useful exercise.

Those with orphan blocks could use them to make a cushion or premmie quilt or they could make more of the same block to combine in different patterns.



Gail showed us the finished applique quilt which she designed for her BOM project. It is quite intricate and I don't think anybody else had completed the quilt although some completed blocks were shown.

There was a nice selection of premmie quilts to go to the hospital -



Including this cheerful one by Linda. She cuts all her scraps of fabric into squares whilst working on a project and has then used some of them to make these heart blocks.



Sonia showed us a felted bag which she had made using an embellisher machine. The oblongs are fixed in place by a set of needles which pierce the fabric and enmesh the fibres.

She has then decorated one side with buttons and stitches.

Most of the quilts we make are incubator covers which go to the hospital in Basingstoke but Project Linus also distribute larger quilts to children and young people who have been through a traumatic time.

We now have the name of a local lady, Shelagh, who will collect any larger quilts. Please get in touch if you would like her contact details.

Also Hilary has contact details of a similar organisation which gives quilts to young people coming out of care.

The club has wadding for the incubator quilts and woven labels to sew on to them. Please ask at a meeting if you need anything.

There is also a suitcase of donated fabrics which can be used to make charity quilts which Pat brings to most meetings.
