Sarah showed us a modern wall hanging using sheers and Boro type stitching.



Caroline showed a large quilt which she had just finished with hand quilting. Most of the top and the remaining fabric had been found in the donations suitcase but the maker remains a mystery?

I have a Bernina machine which I had not used for at least six months but which I have kept to bring to workshops. I thought I had better remind myself how to thread it etc. but when I switched it on it was completely dead.

He had one last look online for spares before I got in contact with the shop where it came from to arrange to bring it in.

He entered the model number and up came a YouTube video under the heading Bernina Sewing Machine not Starting. It was an American site which advised switching on the machine and then leaving it while you had a coffee.....

It transpired that the machine needed to re-boot which could take anything up to an hour.

Sure enough my machine sprang into life after about twenty minutes....

What made us laugh though was their offer for you to leave your machine with them and for \$60 they would fix it—having just told you that all you had to do was switch it on!!

Anyway, I guess this could happen with any make of machine which has a computer built in so I hope that I might save somebody the worry and cost when they turn on their machine and nothing happens.....
