Annette is one of our newer members and to improve her skills she has done a 9 week course at Quilters Dream in Andover. She brought a quilt to show which is a sampler of various blocks which have been very neatly put together and completed with navy blue sashing.



Jan had been busy completing her Block of the Month, the one organised by Sue. She turned it into a table-topper for her dining room.



Also a wall hanging using the ideas given by Marianne in her Art Quilts workshop.

Jan has worked on a Japanese theme for her inspiration and tried out many different machine and hand techniques.

It has been hung on a piece of bamboo.



Hazel had brought along a quilt which had been started by an ex-member, Dawn. She was unable to finish it so asked whether anybody else would like to do so. Hazel has hand quilted it using a puckered quilting technique which adds interest and texture.



Maureen brought in a quilt which she had completed during lockdown which uses EPP hexies to form the pattern.



Teresa showed a Bargello quilt which she had not been happy with initially so she re-stitched it in the ditch and it looked much better.



Pat B, a member who is not able to get to meetings easily, had sent in a carrier bag full of mug rugs for the tombola at the exhibition. Many thanks.



Several members had made premmie quilts for donation—Maureen, Pat Bu, Jan—and Geraldine who had used hers to practice quilting with rulers.



April Meeting

Sue had been busy once again preparing samples of Crazy Patchwork. Members had also prepared a block using either crazy pieces or strips which Sue then encouraged them to embellish with embroidery stitches. Some had been foundation pieced, others had no backing.

She suggested stiches such as fly stitch, lazy daisy, French knots, buttonhole stitch etc. using thick embroidery thread. Also silk ribbon embroidery and sequins and beads.



The seams of the pieces could be followed or the patterns on the fabric enhanced...



This technique could also be used to practice using machined embroidery stitches.

The pieced fabric could also be layered and completed using the 'quilt as you go' method.



Examples of how this technique could be used were brought in by other members.



Rita had great fun creating a cover for her sketch book.

Jean brought in an embellished workbox.....



Many thanks to Sue for organising this demonstration. We will look forward to seeing some other members completed items and make a display of them at the exhibition.

Next month she will be showing us how to make a Bargello design. Instructions will be sent on how to prepare your strips for cutting.
