# **Show and Tell**

Cat has gone into mass production! She is running a stall at the Artisan Market in Newbury and she has 42 quilts for sale....

She showed us a quilt made from mostly Kaffe Fassett fabrics and asked us to try and find the one piece which was not from his studio...



She also showed us a quilt made for her daughter which she had made from a jellyroll and pointed out just how big a quilt could be made from one jellyroll. (sorry I did not get a picture)

Jan and Geraldine had completed their Bargello samples from last month and turned them into premmie quilts.



Just see how different they can look.

New member Sue L had also completed hers but she was not very happy with the binding—she had machined it onto the back then folded it over to the front and finished

it with a line of machine stitching as she had seen online.

She asked for any advice on how it could have been done more precisely. More fabric to fold over was the main suggestion.



Teresa had also made a pretty blue and white premmie which I also failed to get a picture of, sorry. (my excuse is that I was taking minutes in the absence of Pauline).



I (Caroline) showed a framed piece of work which was the result of a workshop run by Marianne on Art Quilts.

She showed us many different ways of making marks, using threads, stitches and cutting dies to experiment on small pieces of fabric. We first chose a theme—either a subject or a colour and gathered appropriate materials and photographs which could be used. The resulting pieces could then be cut and pieced to create a quilt of any size, more pieces being made if necessary.







My theme was sewing techniques, equipment and fabrics from the time when my grandmother would have been sewing which was mainly in the 1920's and 1930's.

My plan is to do another for my mother in the 1950's and 1960's and then one for me in the 1960's and 1970's.....



## June Meeting—Apliquick



Gail had prepared a pack for each member so that she could teach the applique method which she had used to make all of the intricate pieces for her Block of the Month flowers quilt and her Willow Pattern quilt



It is a system for which you can buy specialized pieces of equipment but Gail had worked out that once she had the basic adhesive fabric she could make do with a pencil, a cuticle stick and a cocktail stick. We had been asked to bring a basting gluestick which is especially made for gluing fabric as it dries without marking.

She had provided the templates for a heart and for a flower with six petals. We drew these onto the Apliquick fabric and cut them out. This can be done on either side if the shape is symmetrical but onto the shiny side if it is handed.

This was then ironed onto the reverse of a piece of fabric and the shape was cut out along with a margin of a scant quarter inch. If the shape included curves, e.g. the heart, then the edges were snipped almost to the

edge of the Apliquick.

A line of glue was then put carefully around the outline of the Apliquick shape, a small stretch at a time so that the glue was still tacky. Using the cuticle stick with its flat end to hold the shape steady, the cut edge was then folded over using the cocktail stick and was held in place by the line of glue. It worked very well as we gradually worked our way around the heart.

The heart was a very simple shape but the method gave a very neat finish to a piece which could then be appliqued onto a background. Because Gail had worked with this method a lot she was able to achieve tiny pieces or very intricate shapes. She had brought along a flaming sun for anybody who wanted to attempt a more difficult piece!

Gail also advised that when appliqueing the shape to the background it was best to tone your thread to the shape rather than to the background.

Many thanks must go to Gail for teaching us this technique.
