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

July Meeting

Geraldine led the meeting and updated members about various items.

MSQ Exhibition

She has been to Newbury College again along with Linda's husband and he has drawn up a variety of suggested layouts for the quilt stands. With a few more cross-members for the stands we should be able to hang about 80 quilts.

Each quilt will need a hanging sleeve which will be demonstrated in the August meeting as well as details being sent in an email.

A rota will be drawn up soon as a lot of help will be needed each day to make it a successful event.

The college principal has agreed to open the exhibition and will encourage students and parents to come.

Access to the building will be from 2pm and Julia has volunteered her husband and his van to move the stands from Woolton Hill for us.

It has yet to be decided where, when and how to receive the quilts.

The raffle tickets are ready and distribution was begun at the meeting. Please get in touch if you cannot make it to the meetings and would like some sent to you. Please bring the money raised to each meeting and give to Teresa.

If you know any of the quilts you will be exhibiting please fill in the label form which was sent out in an email . It can either be filled in online, printed out and given to Linda or hand written onto the printed sheet. She has some printed copies if you need them.

Sandra has requested a lot more mug rugs and any small items such as needle cases, scissor holders, pincushions, key fobs etc. The tombola is now going to be a Lucky Dip and we will need enough for the two days of the exhibition.

These can be any size and fabric can be provided from the suitcase. It was suggested that these could be made at one of the SOS Days.

All the money we raise will be match funded by the Greenham Common Trust so the more people who come, raffle tickets we sell etc. the better

Festival of Quilts

July Meeting — shadow quilting

Geraldine had prepared some kits for members to have a go at Shadow Quilting. She had used the fabric which was left over from the Rapid City raffle quilt.

She showed us a mini quilt made by Julia Gahagan during an on-line workshop.

The <u>shadow</u> refers to the use of a very fine net as the top layer of the quilt. The decorative pieces of fabric are adhered (using something like the glue pen which we also used for the Appliquick demonstration) and then the quilting is done through all the layers to hold the design in place.

Geraldine had ordered the fine net directly from Julia but chiffon or organza could also be used.

Jean also showed us a sample which she had worked in which the images of butterflies had been cut from a napkin. The completed works are for display rather than use so all sorts of materials could be incorporated.

Apologies for not getting any photos of these pieces. I did not get a chance to join in as I was dealing with the library books.

Geraldine had used a toolbox to make up a set of basic needlework tools to bring to meetings. If you find that you have forgotten something while having a go at these projects then please ask to use something from the box.

By-the-By

On 22nd July I attended a very interesting talk at Shaw House on Tudor dress. It was given by Ninya Mikhaila who is an expert on historic clothing, in particular fabrics and methods of construction and decoration. This talk was concerned with the dress of ordinary people rather than the nobility seen in most portraits. There were laws about which fabrics and colours could be worn so people had to make the most of what they

were allowed.



As well as the illustrated talk she brought samples of reproductions which she had made and she also had some reproduction tools.



This is a simple ruff with a decorative blanket-stitch edge.



A sleeve (a separate garment worn over the more washable undergarments). This shows slashing as a form of decoration. A bit like the ripped jeans of today, the slashings showed that you were wealthy enough to cut the fabric . Often the edges were not even finished so that the fabric frayed....



Printing did not involve dyes at this time. It referred to a pattern embossed onto the fabric, this sample is velvet, using a heated metal tool. Ninya had some reproduction tools with her but both these and her books were too expensive to be tempted by—it was all serious stuff!

There are two more talks at Shaw House . On 12th August there is another one about Tudor Dress and on 16th September one on Victorians and Edwardian dress in West Berkshire .
