October Meeting and AGM

Geraldine opened the meeting by thanking Gail and Sue for their help in preparing samples and demonstrations for the activities during the year.

She also thanked Pauline for her secretarial work in a post which she has held for eight years.

She thanked the sub-committee for all the organisation for the imminent exhibition—Sherri and Tina for catering supplies; Sandra for sorting the work for the sales table; Linda for the quilt labels and her husband John for masterminding the layout; Cat and Caroline for their publicity work and the rest of the committee for their contribution at meetings.

During the year outings had been arranged to the Malvern Spring Quilt Show and the Festival of Quilts in Birmingham. The Club again had a promotional stall at the Wash Common Show and an enjoyable Social Gathering was held in August.

Teresa gave the treasurers report. The club has 46 members and there is an average attendance at meetings of 21.

The accounts were still being audited but at the end of July the Club held £5,768.

It was therefore decided that the annual subs be reintroduced at £30pa but that there would be no extra payment for attendance at each meeting.

Payment can be made by cash or cheque or payed online. If you pay directly to the bank can you please send an email to Teresa saying that you have done so.


Geraldine then confirmed that she would be standing down as Chair and that Pauline would no longer be the Secretary. She asked for members to take on these roles and there were no volunteers.....

Three members offered to be on the committee—Sarah, Linda, Sue C and Cat so a meeting date was arranged.

Geraldine, Pauline and Gail were presented with a bouquet of flowers to thank them for their hard work.

The AGM was closed and the meeting continued.

2022 Exhibition at Newbury College



The exhibition was a great success! Geraldine thanked everybody who had helped to make it so.

There were 350 paying visitors so despite the cost of hiring this larger venue a slight profit was made.

The staff at Newbury College were very accommodating and helpful throughout. The exhibition was opened by Iain Wollff the principal who was very appreciative of the work on show as his wife was a needlewoman and his mother had been a tailoress. He stressed the need to pass on skills and enthusiasm to the next generation.

Linda's husband, John, was able to give expert advice on the use of the space and the layout of the stands. It was realised that some members had made quilts which were too large to be displayed on our stands—fortunately we were able to hire some from Ridgeway Quilters



rather than having to make some more. Along with a team of willing husbands he supervised the hanging of all the 110 quilts.

The work of 32 members was hung—the number, size, and complexity of the quilts probably reflected the time allowed by lockdown and the extra two years since the last exhibition in 2017. Marianne and Gail had the task of curating the quilts once they had been dropped off.

One visitor commented that there were more quilts on display than at the Autumn Malvern Show!



The raffle quilt was won by member Maureen Slade and the playmat by visitor P. Lawrence. There were 26 prizes in total so there were many happy prizewinners and £1,100 will be sent to the charity Time to Talk.



Tina supervised the running of the refreshments along with Sherri, Sarah and a rota of volunteers. They made about £700 and the visitors were very appreciative of the home-made cakes.

Sandra set up and ran the sales table with her team of helpers and they too made a good profit.

Teresa had responsibility for the money so was busy all weekend. She had organised match funding by Greenham Common Trust which helped to cover the costs.

Cat had her own stall in the sales area and was pleased to sell quite a few quilts. The other traders—Village Fabrics, Purple Stitches and Running Chicken all had profitable days.

Newbury Creative Stitchers—to which many of the MSQ members also belong—had a display and a sale of work. They were very pleased with the sale of cards and other donated goods.

There were small displays of other work which had been made at various workshops. In particular was the selection of Bargello premmie quilts organised by Sue C.





A meeting was held a week later to review the exhibition and Geraldine is compiling a file of information and advice for next time—on the understanding that she will not be running it!!

Particular thanks must also go to Geraldine's husband John who is a photographer. He recorded of all the quilts hung and I will include a random selection. All of the quilts can be viewed on the website.


















